

etting skilled manpower is a significant challenge for small-scale industries. SME units generally do not have the same level of visibility and reputation as larger, well-established firms. It has been observed that many candidates prefer larger companies even if the work location is away from home. Nurturing and retaining manpower is the need of the hour for SMEs. SMEs will have to market and brand themselves so that they are able to attract the right candidates for the industry.

Anticipating the shortage of skilled manpower in the industrial area, KIA started STRIVE (world bank funded project for training apprentices) in 2021. Industries can take apprentices through the STRIVE program and nurture them in their organizations. As per government law, all establishments having work force (regular and contract employees) of 30 or more are mandated to undertake Apprenticeship Programs (NAPS+NATS) in a range from 2.5% -15% of its workforce (including direct contractual employees) every year. Industries should take advantage of this program so that they don't face shortage of manpower in the future.

Karnataka government is having a Karnataka Skill connect portal which acts as a bridge between the Employers searching for manpower and aspirants searching for job. Industries need to register themselves on the portal. The portal acts like a job search website and provides different filter criteria to help in the search of the right



The Micro, Small and Medium Enterprise Development (MSMED) Act, 2006 contains provisions for Delayed Payment to Micro and Small Enterprise (MSEs). State Governments need to establish Micro and Small Enterprise Facilitation Council (MSEFC) for settlement of disputes on getting references/ filing on Delayed payments. MSEFC has come up with a centre at Mangalore which is being operated from Office of the Joint Director, District Industries Centre, Yeyyadi, Mangalore. Considering the importance of KIA, the government has given representation to KIA in the council. One member will be nominated by KIA to the MSEFC council. Members can approach KIA office for any information regarding filing application with MSEFC. Having a valid Udyam Aadhar is a pre-requisite for filing case with MSEFC.

Baikampady's Environmental Crusade: Battling Gurupura River Pollution with a CET Plant

In a significant move towards environmental responsibility, Baikampady Industrial Area is set to address its long-standing pollution issue in Gurupura River. Karnataka Legislative Council Assurance Committee Chairman BM Farooq announced that a common effluent treatment (CET) plant with a capacity of 600 KLD will be established on a two-acre site within the industrial zone.

For decades, the effluents from more than 183 industries in the region have been discharged into the Gurupura River, causing severe pollution. Chairman Farooq emphasized the dire consequences of this pollution, citing the extinction of two fish species in the river and the resulting health problems faced by those who consumed them.

The Karnataka Industrial Area Development Board (KIADB) has initiated the CET plant's construction following a directive from the National



Green Tribunal. Additionally, the mismanagement of the underground drainage network in Ullal has forced numerous residents to abandon their homes nearby.

During his inspection of HPCL's LPG cavern, Chairman Farooq expressed concerns about Mangaluru's vulnerability, as the city hosts two under ground facilities for storing LPG and petroleum.

He noted the absence of a proper evacuation plan in the event of an emergency.

The National Environmental Environmental Engineering Research Institute (NEERI) has submitted a comprehensive pollution report, detailing its impact on Jokatteresidents and surrounding areas.

Chairman Farooq revealed that the committee would carefully study the report and recommend necessary actions to the government. Furthermore, they have requested a detailed health report for individuals living in close proximity to OMPL.

Chairman Farooq stressed the importance of evaluating the carrying capacity of the region to regulate industrial activities effectively. He mentioned that the committee has already resolved nearly 90% of the 2,000 assurances received this year, highlighting their commitment to addressing environmental concerns.

In this crucial endeavor to protect the environment and public health, Baikampady Industrial Area is taking proactive measures. The establishment of a CET plant demon strates the region's dedication to mitigating

pollution in the Gurupura River, ensuring a cleaner and healthier future for all.
